Seasonal Residential **Ride-Along with Yard** Waste

Residents Include food scraps in their existing yard waste containers

Pros

- No added cost for residents
- No added bins
- No route changes for haulers

Cons

- Seasonal (April November)
- Low participation without education



Residential Year-**Round Compost**

Yard waste and food scraps are collected in a third bin, similar to recycling and landfill waste

Pros

- Year-round service
- Consistency allows for better resident education
- OPTION to reduce frequency and balance

Cons

- MAY be additional cost
- Greater hauler
- Lack of education causes low participation
- Need enough participants to be worth it to hauler



Container Swap

At-the-door pickup of food scraps through subscription

- **Pros** Year-round service
- Clean containers reduce smells
- OPTION for multi-unit buildings and businesses

Cons

- Additional cost to residents
- Lack of education causes low participation



Municipal Drop-Off

Municipalities provide a drop-off site where residents bring their food scraps

Pros

- Low to no added cost
- If drop-off is supervised effectively

Cons

- Less convenient for
- Lack of education causes low participation



Drop-Off Events

Municipalities provide a drop-off site where residents bring their food scraps at a specific date and time

Pros

• Resident engagement and education

Cons

- · Requires more contact with haulers for pickup outside of normal route
- Timing / schedule flexibility
